#### Dear Parents/Carers

Welcome to this week's newsletter.

Sadly we have had to deal with some issues where children have been accessing online apps which are not age appropriate. We had to ask our local police constable to come in to school to talk to the children and emphasise how serious this is. This is something which takes place outside of school and parents need to be more aware of what children are accessing outside of school time and monitor how social media is used.

In school, we regularly talk to the children about how to keep safe online. This is built into our computing curriculum as well as PSHE. We also have filters in place to prevent access to inappropriate social media content. Access to social media and age inappropriate games and apps are having a huge impact on the mental health of children and we are seeing this more frequently in school. We have had examples of children in Years 4, 5 or 6 who have been using **Tik Tok**, **WhatsApp**, and **Roblox**, to name but a few.

<u>It is the responsibility of the parent/carer</u> to oversee their child/children's use of technology. Parents must ensure that the children are not using apps or games that are not age appropriate. It is having an impact on learning as children bring disputes and grievances into class and teachers end up using valuable learning time trying to sort out issues which arise outside of school.

In future, if this occurs, we will refer the matter to Brent Front Door and flag this issue as a <u>Safeguarding Matter.</u>

#### **Tiktok**

The full **TikTok** experience is intended for users **age 13 and over**. If you learn that your child under the age of **13** has registered for a **13+** TikTok account, contact them at: <a href="https://www.tiktok.com/legal/report/privacy">https://www.tiktok.com/legal/report/privacy</a>. They will promptly take appropriate action.

#### **WhatsApp**

The minimum age of use for WhatsApp is 16 years old. It had previously dropped to 13 years old but in April 2018 returned to 16, as a response to data-protection legislation.

### Safer Internet Day

Safer Internet Day is celebrated every year on a Tuesday in mid-February. In 2022, it will be on the 8th of February. Safer Internet Day is an event, organised by the UK Safer Internet Centre, which aims to promote safe, responsible and positive use of internet technology.

The theme of Safer Internet Day 2022 is 'All fun and games? Exploring respect and relationships online'. This year looks at online gaming, chat functions, streaming and video. The day will celebrate young people's role in creating a safer internet however they choose to use it, from creating content to interacting with friends and peers.

#### Roblox

The account controls are optional; children of any age can create an account on Roblox with no parental restrictions. On accounts of children under 13, Roblox automatically defaults to stricter settings, but a child could change these if there's no parent PIN.
