Key Idea:

This framework is intended as the second in the Spring Term 2021/22– leading from the beginning of Lent to Good Friday. It continues to focus on the Gospel of Luke in inviting pupils to read and study Luke's account of the Passion of Jesus. During this unit, pupils will also learn about the Stations of the Cross.

Attitudes and Spiritual Dispositions

Spiritual Outcomes: It is hoped that pupils will develop:

- A sense of reflection and prayer
- An openness to the presence of God in the Eucharist

 A willingness to be part of Lent and Easter celebrations

Activities to try at home

You are the first educator of your child in faith. Your child's learning in religious education will be much greater if you and the school are engaged in talking about the same ideas and beliefs.

Adopt some Lenten practices at home this Lent: Pray; given alms (give to charity) and give
ups something. As a family decide to give up a negative attitude or behaviour this Lent such
as being critical, thoughtless, nagging or avoiding responsibilities.
