### **Dear Parents/Carers**

You will have heard in the news that teachers who are members of the National Education Union (NEU) have voted in favour of strike action in connection with a national dispute with the Secretary of State for Education, over teachers' pay.

The days currently planned for strike action in our region are:-

- Wednesday, 1st February 2023
- Thursday, 2nd March 2023
- Wednesday, 15th March 2023
- Thursday, 16th March 2023

The industrial action means that we are not able to open the school to some pupils on those days. I appreciate that this action could cause disruption to the learning of our pupils and that families may have to make alternative childcare arrangements during this time. I am sorry for any inconvenience this may cause but this dispute is, as you are aware, a national issue.

### **Punctuality**

We are noticing an increase in late arrivals at school in the morning. It is vitally important that children attend school on time every day. The soft start time in the morning is an opportunity for children to respond to marking and feedback from teachers and also some valuable learning is taking place at this time.

It is also a good life skill as children progress to secondary school and out into the world of employment. Punctuality is very important and needs to be embedded at a young age.

### **ISP Meetings**

If your child is currently working on an ISP, teachers will arrange a meeting with you to discuss progress and discuss any new targets which will be put in place.

### **Volunteers Needed**

To help promote reading for pleasure', we are looking for volunteers to hear children read. Volunteers must be willing to commit to at least an hour a week on a regular basis (preferably in the afternoon), and be willing to listen to children read in all year groups - ranging from Reception to Year 6. All volunteers will need to be DBS checked in line with the Safeguarding policy. ### <u>Uniform</u>

We have noticed more and more children wearing incorrect uniform. All parents have signed a home school agreement to follow the school requirement for uniform. Please ensure that correct uniform is worn. If unsure, check on the school website for the correct items. We have also seen children wearing incorrect footwear, some of which is not only incorrect uniform but offers little in foot support and could actually cause damage to growing feet. School coats need to be in school colours of black or navy. Tights are also not to be worn under jogging bottoms on PE days. If people persist in ignoring this, you will be asked to have a meeting with the Chair of Governors to discuss this.

### <u>Jewellery</u>

The school has worked hard to ensure that any child who needs extra support is included in a booster class. These booster classes are **compulsory** for the students involved and we ask you to be on time for those classes that take place before school. The early morning classes will start promptly at 8am. When children come late they are missing out on valuable learning. If your child is in an afterschool booster class, please ensure that you are on time to pick them up once the class has finished.
